A Call for Art Submissions for K-12



Attention students, educators, and parents across the Natural State!

The Windgate Museum of Art at Hendrix College in Conway is opening a call for art submissions from Arkansas students, grades Kindergarten through 12th. Beginning in late January of 2024, the Windgate Museum of Art will be celebrating the upcoming total eclipse of the sun with an entire semester of space-based educational programming and exhibitions. There's no better way to celebrate this momentous occasion than by opening our window gallery to the K-12 students of Arkansas!

We are seeking 2D artworks in any medium that in some way depict an *eclipse*, the cosmos, the solar system, or human interaction with space. Submitted artworks will be juried, and 80 will be selected in total across all grades. We ask that no original pieces be sent in. We will be taking the digital submissions and printing those for display.

Students whose artwork is selected, as well as their families, will be honored at a reception following the exhibition opening. Exhibiting students will receive an award certificate and a limited-edition eclipse poster. Student artwork may be submitted by either the parent/guardian or the teacher. Limit 3 submissions per student. **Online submissions are due no later than 5:00 p.m., January 19, 2024.**
